MUSKWA COMPETES AT JPL

Pasadena, CA

Muskwa's intrepid engineers, fresh from their victory at the preliminary round of the JPL Invention Challenge, advanced to the finals this month. The final round of competition was held at the Jet Propulsion Laboratory in Pasadena, CA. This facility, managed by NASA for CalTech, is home to most of the United States' unmanned space operations, including the Voyager probes and the Curiosity rover.



Muskwa's team arrived bright and early on December 6, with the great Muskwan machine Charlotte Pipe's Thundering Double Bogey in tow. Also competing were other school teams and JPL Engineers, who were in a separate category. One team actually flew all the way from Turkey, and presented the judge with a fabulously beautiful porcelain plate with his name on it (hmmm...no wonder they got third place...). Unfortunately, Muskwa's team did not place in

the finals, but it was a big success to advance that far. Only six teams were able to successfully complete the task during the finals.

However, the real treat came when Muskwa cousin Shannon Vaughn took the Muskwa contingent, consisting of Nick Mitchell (PH), William Whittenbury (PH), Robert Bacon (PH), Cole Bacon (PS) and parents John Whittenbury, Beth Whittenbury, Meg Bacon, Robert Bacon, and Jason Mitchell, on a behind-the-scenes tour of the facility.

The cohort visited the small museum, which featured a video of the complex operation used to land the *Curiosity* rover on the red planet. Next. the Muskwans got to see the clean room, where spacecraft are assembled (including the three recent Mars rovers.)



The Mars Yard was also a treat. Here, the Muskwans got to see the imitation Martian landscape where rovers are taken for test drives. A fully functional prototype of *Curiosity* was on display in a garage, and the Muskwans were amused to learn that the tires on the rover include Morse code for "JPL" in their tire treads.



Yet perhaps the neatest thing on the trip was Space-flight Operations, essentially mission control of all of NASA's robotic spacecraft. Transmissions were seen coming in from outside the solar system from the Voyager I probe. The Muskwans even got to sit at the operations computers and wear the headsets used by NASA director Charles Bolden.



Overall, the JPL expedition easily ranks amongst the best Muskwan field trips since the practice first began in 2010. All the Muskwans were thoroughly inspired by man's reach for the stars.

What's next for Muskwa engineering? Find out at the Muskwa Engineering Open House on January 4 at the Bacon home, 30203 Via Rivera, Rancho Palos Verdes, from 4-6 PM. Muskwa's rockets will be on display as well as information about the Proteus whalecounting drone. Come be inspired!

PROJECT PROTEUS

Hermosa Beach, CA

Muskwa's drone project has faced a tumultuous course on its way to development, but the effort to build an unmanned whalecounting aircraft is back on track!

Muskwa's Project Proteus is headed by Nikos Villarreal-Styles of the Mira Costa Chapter in Manhattan Beach, CA. Nikos has been working on a major component of the vehicle, an adaptive wing, over the past year.

The Proteus air vehicle intends to use adaptive wing tech-

nology to use thermals in the air to stay aloft, like a glider.

One intended mission profile for the aircraft is a census of Pacific gray whales migrating to Mexico around the western coast of Catalina-not visible to mainland-based whale census trackers.

Muskwa hopes to base the drone on the Isthmus of Catalina, allowing it to track the whales using advanced software.

In order for this to happen, much work has to be accomplished. Considerations include FAA regulations, conditions, and cost. However, a team working together can accomplish anything.

Ancillary projects to Proteus will include the construction of a Wind Tunnel and a naval expedition to Catalina to study atmospheric conditions.

MUSKWA LAUNCHES SOCIAL MEDIA ASSAULT

One of the most important fronts in the continuing battle to save the vaquita exists in the realm of cyberspace. As Muskwan Aidan Bodeo-Lomicky stated, social media "is the only way to easily spread information across the globe in seconds."

To this end, Muskwa convened a roundtable on social media at Muskwa HQ on December 15. Muskwans William Whittenbury (PH), Jarred Dahlerbruch (PH) and Hannah Kim (PV) discussed a wide range of options. It was decided that a unified social media platform was a must, and that vaquita-specific efforts should come from a vaquita-specific source. To that end, Muskwa established a separate "save the vaquita" Twitter account. Muskwa also plans to expand into Vine and to create a vaquita sweatshirt that will act "as a walking billboard."

Bodeo Lomicky (BT) launched an effort to create a vaquita tweetstorm on New Years' Day. A tweetstorm is an event when many people promote the same hashtag at once- in this case, #SaveTheVaquita. A similar effort to raise awareness of the endangered Maui's dolphin attracted over 11,000 retweeters, surpassing Beyonce.
